



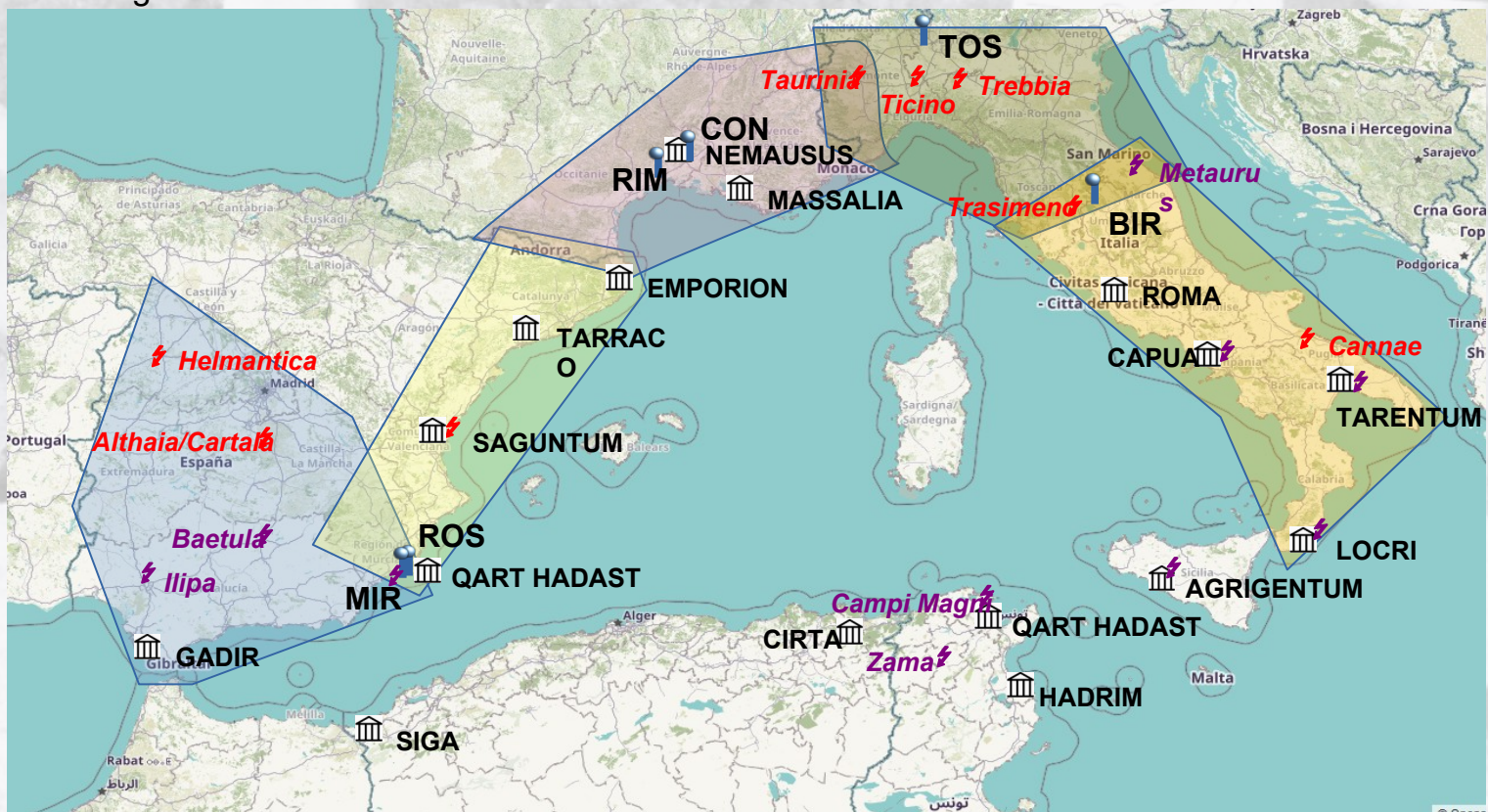

Segments and sites

Segmentation of the Hannibal's Road

- Each college is located in one segment.
- Each geographical segment includes the place where the partner is located.
- Each segment covers a geographical area which enables the students to focus on specific historical events, tourist points of interest, local cultures, linguistic diversity, and socio-economical features.
- The 5 segments resulting therefrom form a unique chain which links are overlapping : this enable to share a common area with its connex partner(s). In particular :
 - ✓ MIR and ROS areas are both covering Cartagena
 - ✓ ROS and RIM are both covering the Pyrenees Mountains
 - ✓ RIM and CON are both covering the oppidum of Ambrussum (Villetelle)
 - ✓ CON and TOS are both covering the Alps to Turin
 - ✓ TOS and BIR are both covering the strip covering Trasimene and the Metaurus
- This proposal can be challenged. For example :
 - ✓ One can imagine to group these 6 segments 2 by 2 according to the 3 countries Spain, France, and Italy (this has been done for France).
 - ✓ The segmentation could evolve so as to include newcomers in the network of Ambassadorial Colleges
- The main cities as well as the carthaginian and roman victories which appear on the map are not limitative : these are more a sample of what the students can take into consideration in their own segment.

■ Each college will select in the left column of the table corresponding to its segment the sites that will be investigated by the students in order to illustrate the Hannibal's road.

- ✓ Preselections have been proposed for the French and Italian segments in the left column. Additional sites can be selected from the other column(s).

■ In Spain :

- ✓ Language: Spanish / Latin
- ✓ The itinerary of the Via Augusta has been described because it partially follows the one of Hannibal on the Via Heraklea
- ✓ All the moves and battles which took place in Spain before the start of 2nd Punic War and during the stay of Hannibal in Italy have not been considered. Nevertheless, sites related to events which took place during these periods could be added to the list (e.g., Baetula, or Helmantica).
- ✓ *Idioma: Español / Latín*
- ✓ *El itinerario de la Vía Augusta ha sido descrito porque sigue parcialmente el de Aníbal en la Vía Heráclea*
- ✓ *No se han tenido en cuenta todos los movimientos y batallas que tuvieron lugar en España antes del inicio de la Segunda Guerra Púnica y durante la estancia de Aníbal en Italia. No obstante, podrían añadirse a la lista sitios relacionados con acontecimientos ocurridos durante esos períodos (por ejemplo, Baetula o Helmántica).*

■ In France :

- ✓ Language : French / Latin
- ✓ The itinerary of the Via Domitia has been described because it partially follows the one of Hannibal on the Via Heraklea, in particular in Occitania
- ✓ All the known variants of the Hannibal's road described in the literature have not been reminded in this document
- ✓ *Langue : Français / Latin*
- ✓ *L'itinéraire de la Via Domitia a été décrit car il suit partiellement celui d'Hannibal sur la Via Heraklea, en particulier en Occitanie*
- ✓ *Toutes les variantes connues de la route d'Hannibal décrites dans la littérature n'ont pas été rappelées dans ce document*

■ In Italy :

- ✓ Language : Italian / Latin
- ✓ All the moves of Hannibal (and punic armies) in Italy during the 2nd Punic War have not been reminded in this document, due to the long duration of his stay
- ✓ Sardinia and Sicily have not been considered in this document, though episodes of the 2nd Punic War took place there
- ✓ *Lingua: Italiano / Latino*
- ✓ *Tutte le mosse di Annibale (e degli eserciti punici) in Italia durante la seconda guerra punica non sono state ricordate in questo documento, a causa della lunga durata del suo soggiorno*
- ✓ *La Sardegna e la Sicilia non sono state considerate in questo documento, anche se gli episodi della seconda guerra punica si sono svolti lì*

EL CAMINO DE ANÍBAL entre Cástulo y Saetabis es un trazado jalonado por abundantes pruebas arqueológicas, en especial en sus dos primeros tercios: el tramo entre Cástulo y Saltigi (actual Chinchilla de Monte Aragón). A grandes rasgos, iría por Ad Aras, Garibaile, Ad Morum, Venta de San Andrés, Montirón, Venta Quemada, Venta de los Ojuelos, Mantesa, Uveros, El Balletero, Libisosa (Lezuza) y Tiriez, hasta Saltigi (Chinchilla). El último tercio cruzaría al norte de Horna, Pétrola, La Higuera, Llano de la Consolación, Cerro de los Santos, sur de Marisparza, Tobarilla, noroeste de Caudete, Casas de Albalat, Fuente la Higuera, Mogente, El Pulido y, por último, Saetabis (actual Játiva).
